## 1. School Theme 2019: 'Learning - a lifelong passion'

Each year, a school theme helps us position the approaches we take to teach our students about growing as individuals and contributing as members of a community. In 2018, the school theme was 'Harmonising Towards Excellence', the key messages of which were that individuals contribute to one another's achievement and to collective successes.

The school theme for 2019 is 'Learning – a lifelong passion' and builds on the theme in 2018. Learning is a daily endeavour whether we are conscious or unconscious of the act. Values must be practiced to be internalised. We would like our students to demonstrate <a href="Integrity">Integrity</a> and <a href="Care">Care</a> for themselves and for others by practising school values and observing

school rules. Page 8 and Page 9 of the Student Handbook details the expectations we have of every student in conduct, behaviour, attitude, attire and appearance. Two key items are highlighted below.

Students are not allowed to visit shopping centres and other recreational facilities like playgrounds and cinemas in their school attire unless accompanied by their parents or guardians. School personnel will be on neighbourhood walkabouts after school hours to monitor student conduct.

Do note that students are not allowed to bring mobile and smart electronic devices such as mobile telephones and Ipads and smart watches to school. This is to avoid distractions from lessons and the loss of such valuables. It is also important to nurture students to be responsible and discerning users of technology. Students are to use the pay phones located near the canteen if they need to contact their parents during school hours. Any parent with exceptional reason for his child to bring electronic devices to school, must seek the Principal's prior permission in writing.

## 7. Recess Timings and Lunch Breaks

#### One snack break will be given in between lessons daily at the appropriate times.

Students are to bring their own healthy snacks. They can pack dry food such as cereal, bread, biscuits or fruits such as apple, orange, banana or grapes. All food must be properly packed in a box. In line with promoting a healthy lifestyle in our school, only plain drinking water is allowed during the snack time. We discourage students from bringing snacks that are high in sugar and salt content such as potato chips and chocolates. Do also ensure that your child has a proper breakfast in the morning before coming to school.

#### 10. Jazz Dance lessons for Primary 1 students during curriculum hours

We are pleased to offer the Commonwealth Society of Teachers of Dancing (CSTD) Jazz Dance module during music lessons for all P1 classes. Your Primary 1 child will go through the complete syllabus of the Pre Modern level in Semester 1. Your child should be in PE attire for the music and dance lessons. In April, you will get the option to register your child for the CSTD Jazz Dance Examination (Pre modern level). The examination is optional and will be conducted in school around the month of May. ## 11. Reading Time in the mornings

Reading Time in the mornings is quiet time for all our students to read together. Reading Time is intended to improve our students' language proficiency and to develop life-long reading habits. As our students read each day, they will encounter new words, new sentence structures, and be immersed in ideas. With a continuous reading experience, we hope that

our students will find reading more enjoyable, appreciate the power of language and develop disciplined study habits.

Reading Time takes place before the flag-raising ceremony. When students come to school, they proceed to the assembly area and read an English Language or other Tongue Language story book. Kindly ensure that your child brings a story book daily.

Effective parent-school communication plays an important part in helping your child have a positive school experience. It helps you stay connected with your child's day to day activities in school and your child will benefit tremendously when parents and school work together for the child's holistic development.
